

## Eungella flat early 1930s



Left to Right:

W.B. Swayne's general store (built end 1930 opened Jan 1931) before the 2 story extension was added at the rear as a residence. Swaynes lived in back part until the “Linga Longa” guest house (where this photo is taken from) was pulled down and Wally & Nell (Ellen) Swayne's home “Homeview” was built on that site.

Jimmy Goode's store (small shed in distance) was the first store in Eungella. This was closed down for a while, then Brennan opened it up again when the PEI commenced road works. It then moved to about the middle of the photo.

The cream shed (next to shop),

Bert Burgess' house (in far distance)

The track up the centre is what has become North St, so named because the North's lived up there. It just happens to also be in a northerly direction.

Jimmy Goode's house (far right) over looking the valley. Hence the current name of Goode's Lookout.

This house was also referred to as the Council House and served as a guest house for a time
